Five Key Messages for November 2018 General Elections

Voter's Choice California gathered feedback from election officials and nonprofit partners to identify the top messages for voter education and outreach this November. The following messages were identified as the most important messages to share with voters regarding the Voter's Choice Act.

These messages are for Voter's Choice Act counties (Madera, Napa, Nevada, Sacramento and San Mateo).

1. Voters have more convenient ways of voting.
2. Voters have the option to vote early.
 - a. Avoid lines on Election Day.
 - b. Vote on the weekend. Some vote centers will open 10 days before Election Day.
3. Voters can vote in-person at a vote center, which replaces your neighborhood polling place.
 - a. Vote at any vote center in your county.
 - b. Replace lost ballots at a vote center.
4. All registered voters receive a ballot in the mail, even if they do not request one.
5. Voters can register and vote the same day, all the way up to and on Election Day.
